Additional Information / Prior Funding History:

FY2003 - \$800,000; FY2002 - \$7,500,000.

Project Description/Justification:

Alaska does not have open container and repeat intoxicated driver laws that conform to federal laws (23USC154 and 23USC164). There are funding sanctions imposed because of this. On October 1, 2003, 6% of the National Highway System, Surface Transportation Program, and Interstate Maintenance funds from TEA-21 are being transferred to the Highway Safety Program (23USC402), 3% each law. The anticipated sanction on October 1, 2003 (FFY2004) is approximately \$10.4 million. These funds are 100% federal.

Because the State of Alaska now has a .08% blood alcohol limit for operating a motor vehicle (Chapter 63 SLA 2001), there are incentive funds of approximately \$800,000 per year. These funds are also 100% federal and may be used for any highway improvement or safety program under 23USC, including safety education.
