Project Description/Justification:

Each year, the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration and the State of Alaska, DOT, Division of Measurement Standards and Commercial Vehicle Enforcement enter into an agreement in accordance with Title IV of the Surface Transportation Assistance Act of 1982 and its subsequent amendments referred to as the "STAA". The State Lead Agency (Measurement Standards & CVE) agrees to carry out the implementation of a Motor Carrier Safety Assistance Program each federal fiscal year that is described in the Commercial Vehicle Safety Plan submitted each year. This is an on-going program that will need to be submitted each year.

The Mission Statement for the Commercial Vehicle Safety Plan is "To enforce commercial vehicle regulations with the goal of managing statewide commercial vehicle operations to provide a safe motoring environment while protecting the capital investment in the highway infrastructure."
