Partnership between the State, the Denali Commission and the US Department of Agriculture (USDA) in developing a community profile mapping program to produce community profile maps for approximately 200 communities throughout Alaska over the next five years. This project contributes to the Department's Mission by reducing injuries, fatalities and property damage, by improving the mobility of people and goods and by increasing private investment.

Project Description/Justification:

The Initiative for Accelerated Infrastructure Development (IAID) is a community profile-mapping program managed by the Department of Community and Economic Development (DCED). The IAID partners include the Denali Commission and the US Dept. of Agriculture (USDA) Rural Development. The goal of this program is to produce accurate high quality digital community profile maps for approximately 200 communities around Alaska over a five year time period. The 200 communities were identified because they have not been mapped in the past or their existing maps were out of date. This initiative is funded through partnerships that include State and federal agencies, boroughs and cities, and tribal and Native organizations. By using a partnership approach and sharing the cost of this effort, we are able to map more communities at an accelerated rate, provide a much higher quality product that is based on a set of consistent mapping standards, improve coordination between agencies, and reduce duplication of mapping efforts.

Each profile includes maps at two scales. One map focuses on the developed area of a community and the other map focuses on the area surrounding the community. Information presented on the profiles includes topography, land use, land ownership, and areas subject to flooding and erosion. The profiles provide a consistent source of community information that is easily accessed and that is intended to serve the planning needs of both communities and agencies.
