**Additional Information / Prior Funding History:**

This is the first year of this request.

**Project Description/Justification:**

This project entails creating a paper repository for official public records of Alaska's leaders, and constructing a facility to house the memorabilia of those same leaders.

UAF Rasmussen library is the logical keeper for historically significant documents and official public records. However, archiving and maintaining these important documents comes at a significant cost to the university. The first phase of this project will fund the archival project of approximately 4,000 cubic feet of papers that are historically significant to the state of Alaska.

The second phase of the project includes the construction of a congressional public center that will accommodate some of the interesting memorabilia of Alaska's leaders. Additionally, a multi-purpose room for classes or public meetings would enhance the facility's draw.

This particular opportunity is a new challenge for the university. While the project will be paid for by private funds, a university interest and academic mission will be maintained.
