Project Description/Justification:

This request will provide funding for design, construction and equipment grants in the areas of behavioral health, rural and urban hospitals that support rural primary care services, regional and sub-regional community health centers, rural primary care facilities, assisted living homes throughout the State, and other related facilities that serve Alaskans. The purpose of these funds is to assist providers in maximizing the capacity of the services they provide through renovation, rehabilitation, new construction and equipment purchases.

In many respects, low-volume, small rural hospitals operate like large clinics. They provide mostly primary care and emergency room services. All hospitals and long-term care facilities have continuing capital needs for modernizing and replacing their facilities and for acquiring, upgrading or replacing medical equipment necessary to meet the modern standards of medical care delivery. Failure to invest the funds to meet this need will eventually have financial consequences for hospitals.

These federal funds are primarily Health Resources and Care Administration (HRCA) funds that are appropriated to the Denali Commission and would be granted to the Department of Health and Social Services. The Department intends to use up 2% of this request to cover administrative costs associated with the administration of these funds.
