Prior funding for home modifications included: FY98 \$100.0, FY99 \$100.0, FY00 \$50.0, FY01\$100.0, FY02 \$100.0, and in FY03 \$100.0.

Project Description/Justification:

This request would provide funding for individuals with disabilities with an Individual Plan for Employment (IPE) and who meet the required financial needs test. As the department continues to provide services to the most severely disabled individuals, the need for home modifications, accessible transportation, and assistive technology increases. Without the necessary modification and transportation, an individual cannot take care of personal needs in order to go to work.

The IPE must show transportation, home modifications, or assistive technology is necessary for an individual to participate in a vocational rehabilitation service. A Vocational Rehabilitation Counselor provides guidance on cost options and the necessary modifications a vehicle, home, or work setting will need, based on the individual's disability.

The division estimates up to 30 severely disabled individuals will be served with these funds.

Examples of home modifications include ramps for wheelchairs, modification to bathrooms, and removal of barriers that restrict access. Assistive technology may include environmental control systems and speech controlled computers. Vehicle modifications may include hand controls and lift systems to make a van accessible.
