\$50,000 in one time funding was included in the fiscal note for the legislation creating the Victim Restitution program. Once the RFP was completed, it was determined to be an insufficient amount of funds by about 400 percent. The one-time funds were reversed and are no longer in Law's base operating budget.

Upgrade or enhancement to existing department capabilities? No, this application will replace and existing database.

4. Specifically, what hardware, software, consulting services, or other items will be purchased with this expenditure? (Include a line item breakdown.)

Needs Assessment Planning - \$15,000

Database Design - \$125,000

Install, Test, Convert data, and Train - \$110,000

5. How will service to the public measurably improve if this project is funded? It has the potential to collect additional funds for the State Treasury, which can be used to potentially fund new programs or public works.**6. Does project affect the way in which other public agencies will conduct their business? No.****7. What are the potential out-year cost implications if this project is approved? (Bandwidth requirements, etc.)**

We estimate \$25,000 in annual maintenance costs.

8. What will happen if the project is not approved? The existing database cannot be expanded to include additional collections items. The Department is at the limit in terms of adding new staff and building stand alone databases in order to add new collections. Currently, the corrections surcharge, which was passed at the end of the 2003/2004 legislative session, cannot be collected. The legislation is slated to bring \$700,000 to the State Treasury annually. All that is required to begin to collect those surcharges is funding for this request.
