Additional Information / Prior Funding History:

FY2005 - \$500,000; FY2003 - \$235,000; FY2002 - \$130,000. Per the Department's new cost sharing policy, the community must provide the match for this project.

Project Description/Justification:

The purpose of this program is to inform the public of ways they can reduce carbon monoxide (CO) pollution. In particular, this program emphasizes the control of cold start CO emissions associated with commute trips. These trips are a major source of CO in Anchorage neighborhoods. The campaign encourages plugging in block heaters and the use of alternative modes of transportation to get to work or school. This program is included in the draft Anchorage CO Maintenance Plan.
