Project Description/Justification:

The state received ownership of the Adak Airport in January 2004. Since the Navy's pull out in 1997, buildings on the airport have fallen into disrepair and need to be demolished and replaced. Many of the buildings have become safety hazards when pieces of siding and roof materials routinely come loose and are blown away in the severe inclement weather on Adak. This project will demolish several buildings and construct a much needed, new Airport Rescue and Fire Fighting buildings. Funding is expected to come in as a special appropriation sponsored by Senator Stevens.
