Additional Information / Prior Funding History:

FY2006 - \$7,500,000; FY2004 - \$9,736,000; FY2002 - \$5,262,000.

Project Description/Justification:

This funding includes projects such as design and construction of noise barriers and/or buffers; sound proofing existing residences in high noise areas; improvements identified in the Airport's Ground Noise Study; noise abatement studies; land acquisition; seminars; conferences; other business and community outreach programs on construction techniques for noise reduction and other noise related issues; revising municipal land use ordinances, plats and other joint planning efforts with the Municipality of Anchorage on noise compatible planning; further evaluation of noise abatement measures and other noise related projects. The primary measure at this time, however, is the Residential Sound Insulation Program (RSIP) which retrofits existing structures within the 65 and higher dNL (decible measured noise level). The RSIP is a federally funded program that includes acquisition of avigation easements along with the noise reducing windows and doors.
