## **Project Description/Justification:**

The City of Port Lions has expressed interest in accepting local ownership of the small boat harbor, subject to the State addressing the deferred maintenance issues. The state-owned harbor dock, grid and floats were constructed in early 1980. They have subsequently been maintained and improved by the state. An almost 2000 square foot dock with a 20 by 100 foot pile-supported approach, with a grid on one side, accesses a 114 slip harbor. The cost to upgrade the dock facilities to a "good" condition was estimated to be \$2,750,000 based on a recent survey by the Department of Transportation; due to damage most items used for this estimate were listed as being in poor or failed condition. The proposed action is consistent with the Department's ongoing program to transfer State owned harbors to local communities wherever possible.
