The department does not have sufficient materials to construct a temporary 200-foot bridge. The existing temporary bridge stockpile can be used to create much shorter spans. However, many of our highway bridges have spans greater than 100 feet in length. This project contributes to the Department's Mission by reducing injuries, fatalities and property damage and by improving the mobility of people and goods.

Project Description/Justification:

This project will allow the department to procure and maintain a stockpile of emergency bridge materials that can be used to construct temporary crossings in the event of a bridge failure. Pre-manufactured truss bridge materials capable of building a 200-foot bridge will be purchased and combined with existing bridge inventory. Materials will be stockpiled in both Anchorage and Fairbanks so that response can be provided in either direction if access is lost.
