Project Description/Justification:

The Knik Arm Crossing Project is being developed to connect the Port of Anchorage/Ship creek Industrial Area and Port MacKenzie/Port MacKenzie Development Area, two regionally significant ports and industrial areas. This is a 5.3 mile project that includes a three-lane, 7,000 foot bridge and new approaches that connect to roads that now exist on both sides of Knik Arm.

Also provides for upgrades to Mat-Su Borough roads at the western terminus of the bridge (South Big Lake Road and Burma Road).
