Project Description/Justification:

These funds are for the design of Phase III for the Potter Marsh Trailhead Improvements project. In Phase III, we will design 1000' of boardwalk and create access to the future location of the Bird Treatment Center. Also included will be the design, fabrication, and installation of the interpretive displays on this new boardwalk section.

- This funding plan was recently authorized by Conoco-Phillips for direct use by the Design and Construction Section of Parks Management for construction of the boardwalk portion of the project only.
- A Memorandum of Understanding between the Department of Natural Resources and Conoco-Phillips has been executed.
- Permits will be in place prior to construction.
- Public process has occurred and no objections were noted.

Why is this Project Needed Now:

This is phase III of the Potter Marsh Project funded by Conoco-Phillips. Phase I began in January 2006 with the award of a construction contract for the pilings that would support the boardwalk. The pilings had to be done during the winter so that the wetlands were not disturbed. Once the pilings are in place the second phase can be started with the build out of the

boardwalk to include interpretive displays. Phase II design, permitting, and interpretive planning has begun with anticipated construction starting in the winter months of 2007.
