Department of Labor and Workforce Development Mechanical Inspection Component Budget Summary

## **Component: Mechanical Inspection**

#### **Contribution to Department's Mission**

The Mechanical Inspection component contributes to the department's mission by reducing hazards to life and property posed by unsafe boilers, pressure vessels, elevators, escalators, trams, lifts, and electrical and plumbing work.

#### **Core Services**

Inspect boilers, pressure vessels, elevators, escalators, lifts, and electrical and plumbing work for code compliance.

Issue certificates of fitness to electricians, power linemen, plumbers, boiler operators, asbestos workers, hazardous painters, and explosives handlers.

Assist the Department of Revenue, Child Support Enforcement Division, by identifying certificate of fitness applicants who are in arrears on child support payments.

Provide enforcement assistance to the Department of Community and Economic Development to ensure that electricians, plumbers, construction contractors and electrical/mechanical administrators have proper certificates and licenses.

Enforce Alaska vehicle registration requirements under AS 28.10.121 on construction projects to focus attention on and improve Alaska resident hire. Investigators with special commissions from the Alaska State Troopers may issue citations for vehicles with unlawful out-of-state license plates.

#### Major Activities to Advance Strategies

Test applicants and issue certificates to qualified plumbers, electricians, power line workers and boiler operators. Perform on-site inspections of boilers, pressure vessels, elevators, and electrical and plumbing work for code

compliance.

Issue certificates of fitness for asbestos workers, hazardous painters and explosives handlers.

#### **Key Component Challenges**

Mechanical Inspection has an overdue elevator inspection backlog of about 250 units. In the last five years, the number of elevators in Alaska has increased by 228 units for a total of 953 units. The average inspector can perform 275 inspections per year. If new elevators continue to be constructed at the current rate, there will not be enough inspectors to perform the inspections. Uninspected units can have code compliance issues that pose significant potential risks to public safety.

#### Significant Changes in Results to be Delivered in FY2008

Mechanical Inspection does not anticipate any changes in the results delivered.

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# **Major Component Accomplishments in 2006**

Although the backlog of boiler and pressure vessels increased slightly, 84% of the code violations found were corrected immediately and the remaining code violations should be corrected in the following year.
