Project Description/Justification:

The Department of Corrections has approximately \$14.3 million in state-owned equipment. Replacement of old and worn-out equipment has been deferred for many years and further deferral of this equipment replacement will severely reduce security, decrease food service capability, and other day-to-day operations capability.

This project funds the replacement of antiquated capital equipment at institutions throughout the state. It also includes some new purchases of necessary maintenance, grounds keeping, snow removal, and kitchen equipment. All institutions operate 24 hours a day, seven days a week. This equipment is used constantly and continually supporting life, health, and safety needs of approximately 1,300 officers and other staff, and 3,700 inmates at the institutions. Their sustained use requires funding for routine replacement of old and worn out equipment every fiscal year. These funds will allow the institutional facilities to purchase critical institutional and program support equipment.
