Detailed Project Description and Justification:

Improvements are expected to include a new road base, curbs, pavement, a sidewalk, drainage and street lighting. Design is funded and underway. Storm drain installation is planned for 2010 as part of an upgrade to 72nd Avenue. This request and local match are expected to fully fund the project for construction in 2010 or 2011. This road has deteriorated beyond the point that maintenance is cost effective. Pavement is cracked and heaved and curbs are broken. Significant drainage problems exist in the north half and portions of the road have never been constructed to urban standards. The road serves a high density residential area with increasing traffic. This project is the No. 2 priority for the Abbott Loop Community Council.

In 2008, a state grant was approved by the Legislature for this project but was vetoed.

Project Timeline:

Design expenditures will occur in 2009 and 2010. Construction expenditures are anticipated in 2010 and 2011.
