**Detailed Project Description and Justification:**

This project will construct road and drainage rehab improvements on these local roads. Glaciation and flooding impact safety on these streets. These roads suffer from pot holing, extensive cracking and frost heaving. This project is a priority for the Northeast Community Council. If project design indicates full road reconstruction is required, additional funding will be required. If the full state grant match is not forthcoming in 2010, the match could be provided in phases as noted below:

Design/easements/utilities \$75,000

Construction \$275,000
