Detailed Project Description and Justification:

Renovation of Anchorage Fire Station 9 will expand the living quarters and apparatus bay, and will replace dormitory sleeping quarters with individual sleeping rooms.

Fire Station #9 provides Fire and EMS services in Anchorage to the Lower Hillside, Huffman, O'Malley and Turnagain residents. The station houses a Rescue Truck, engine company, Water Tender, medic unit and AFD Rope Rescue Team.

The facility is referred to unkindly by facility maintenance due to the frequent (weekly) heating and septic challenges.

Fire Station #9 was constructed following Unification with the very first Project '80s dollars to meet the response demands with a single engine and a tender. Responses have grown fivefold and the equipment housed at this facility has doubled. The station provides primary response down the Seward Highway and for all high angle and technical rope work citywide.
