# Togiak - Repair Storm Damage to Seawall

The City of Togiak must do needed repairs to the seawall to insure that future storms will not damage the structure.

**Detailed Project Description and Justification:**

The southern half of the Togiak seawall has approximately 10,000 cubic feet of storm driven material piled in front of the seawall. This allows storm driven waves at high tide to wash over the seawall and damage resident homes and property. This material must be graded back from the seawall to allow 5-7 feet of exposed seawall to stop or repel waves and protect the community from storm damages. Storm damage has occurred at the boat ramps along the seawall with over 500 cubic yards of rock material being washed away and this erosion has the potential of causing damage to the ironwood seawall structure. This material must be replaced this summer to insure a solid seawall structure to protect against summer or fall ocean storms.

Capital funding needs for this project is estimated at \$85,000. \$40,000 for 500 cubic yards of shot rock delivered to the seawall. \$45,000 for heavy equipment rental, fuel, and labor to backfill the boat ramps and to grade the beach side of the seawall.
