Detailed Project Description and Justification:

The community of Hydaburg was placed on a boil water notice 8 months ago. Inadequate metering and monitoring equipment, as well as faulty filters and pumps, have prevented the community from providing purified water on a consistent basis. The City Council has appropriated approximately \$15,000 in local funds to contribute to the upgrade. However, additional funds are required to upgrade the monitoring and metering equipment to comply with DEC and EPA regulations on a consistent basis. The monitoring and metering equipment needed includes turbidimeters, flow meters, chlorometers, pumps and flow switches. The City's request is supported by comments on the EPA's Significant Non-Compliance List which states that an upgrade is needed to comply with the Surface Water Treatment Rule. The lack of a reliable safe drinking water source is a significant health risk to the community and the City's number one priority for funding. The City has made significant improvement with regard to the RUBA assessment and is actively working toward further improvements. The City is scheduled for another assessment this spring in order to qualify for turbine and catchment upgrades through ANTHC and VSW.

Project Timeline:

The project is an urgent health issue for the community and will begin as soon as funding is secured. The projected project duration is two months.
