A percentage of the furniture in schools wears out and must be replaced every year. This includes student and teacher desks, chairs, stools, cafeteria tables and chairs, etc. Schools struggle to find the funds to do this while at the same time, providing other needed equipment, teaching supplies, books, paper, etc. Many times the furniture cannot be replaced. This would allow the school to catch up on needed furniture replacement and devote other scarce funds to teaching equipment and supplies.
