Brief Project Description:

Design and upgrade sixteen unit carport at the local senior housing facility

Funding Plan:**Total Cost of Project: \$850,000***There is no other funding needed***Detailed Project Description and Justification:**

The Valdez Senior Center provides affordable housing for seniors age 55 and over with fifteen apartment units and a sixteen unit carport. These combined facilities were built in 1983. While the main building has received periodic upgrades over the years, the standalone carport has received very little. In a recent architectural evaluation of the carport, significant deficiencies were noted. These include lack of sufficient shear wall resistance to seismic loading, insufficient snow load capacity, heaved and cracked concrete flooring, and undetermined underground deterioration of load bearing main supports. The City of Valdez initially attempted to address concerns with a major maintenance upgrade. However, following the architectural analysis associated with this upgrade, it was determined that the most effective approach would be to demolish the structure and rebuild new. This funding request would fund the design effort necessary for this new project and enable a detailed engineer's estimate of the full cost to construct.

Project Timeline:

The design work will take about 9 months.
