Project Description/Justification:

This is a continuation of a program that provides grant funding to imminently threatened communities to address immediate community needs. Planning assistance will be for the most at-risk villages, and provide a planned approach to shoreline protection, building relocation and/or eventual relocation of the village. At the funding level of \$500.0 the following will be accomplished:

- Hazard Impact Assessment Mini-Grants of \$50.0 to four eligible communities (Nelson Lagoon, Quinhagak, Nightmute, and Elim). These communities have already applied and been approved for projects. Previous funding was not available to award these projects.
- Community Planning Grants of \$150.0 for the two communities (Atmautluak and Kipnuk) that are near completion of their hazard impact assessments and ready to proceed to the planning phase.
