Project Description/Justification:

In 2008, the department engaged the commitment of the Department of Defense Innovative Readiness Training (IRT) program to assist with the village of Newtok's relocation to Nelson Island. The IRT program provides services to American communities in need while providing military training to the Armed Forces. The IRT has committed to providing assistance to Newtok's development of a new village at Mertarvik for a five year period. This commitment is contingent upon a state or local provision of building materials.

The \$4,000,000 for the construction of an evacuation shelter and for building materials to construct an access road to the shelter at Mertarvik are critical to the IRT's ongoing assistance at Mertarvik. This funding is essential to ensuring that the IRT will be engaged at Mertarvik next summer (2010) to construct the access road and begin construction of the evacuation shelter. The 35% Design Analysis Report on the Mertarvik Evacuation Center prepared by the Cold Climate Housing Research Center provided a construction cost estimate of \$3,381,000.
