APED received a \$500,000.00 Denali Commission grant to initiate Alaska Forward.

Project Description/Justification:

The Alaska Partnership for Economic Development (APED) is a 501(c)(3) umbrella organization consisting of the Alaska Regional Development Organizations (ARDORS) and other economic development organization entities, committed to the development of an economic development strategy and accompanying realistic action plan to identify, prioritize, and implement the state's economic development program. Combined, this strategy and plan has been titled the "Alaska Forward Initiative". Alaska Forward is composed of two phases: (1) A situational analysis of the Alaska economy; and, (2) development of an economic development plan and implementation strategies based on the situational analysis.

APED plans to complete the situational analysis by January 31, 2010 and then begin phase two. The development plan and implementation strategies will focus on the various industry sectors, or "clusters" that comprise the drive behind Alaska's economy. APED believes this cluster approach presents a better opportunity for success in promoting economic development.
