

throughout the state’s coastal zone, while protecting, preserving and managing the uses and resources upon which the residents of the state depend for economic and personal livelihood.

The federal monies that are provided in grants generally require a one-to-one match. The match requirements are as follows:

- Federal 306 Funds - one-to-one match (coastal districts provide up to fifty percent local match, while DCOM provides the remaining match)
- Federal 309 Funds - no match required
- Federal ACWA/6217 Funds - one-to-one match

Federal 306 and 309 grant recipients will provide public education and outreach on coastal management issues, conduct and participate in consistency review of proposed projects affecting the coastal zone uses or resources, and participate in other ACMP initiatives. Federal ACWA/6217 grant recipients will provide public education, outreach to Alaskans and oversee activities essential to the development of a policy and institutional framework to implement Alaska’s Coastal Nonpoint Pollution Control Program.

Why is this Project Needed Now:

The ACMP puts federal funding in local economies, and promotes responsible development of coastal uses and resources for economic investment and diversity within the coastal districts. This balancing of resource management and development benefits local communities and the State.
