The Elections Administration Commission informed the Division of Elections that the division had met their GF Match requirement, and that the FY2011 GF Match request is no longer necessary. This reduces the amount being appropriated from the Election Fund by \$74.9, from \$1,499.9 to \$1,425.0.

Project Description/Justification:

In October of 2002, Congress passed the Help America Vote Act of 2002 and determined appropriation amounts for funding requirements of the new election reform bill. There were two types of funding sources available though appropriations to assist the State in meeting these federal mandates.

Title II monies or "requirement payments" were available to states that meet certain mandates of HAVA. Most noteworthy was the development of a State Plan, which the Division has written. Title II monies can only be spent for mandates in Title III (examples: accessible voting units at every polling place, statewide voter registration system, training of election workers and staff, and accessibility issues).

These funds will be used for one or more of the following activities as required in HAVA:

- (A) Complying with the requirements of Title III.
- (B) Improving the administration of elections for Federal Office.
- (C) Educating voters concerning voting procedures, voting rights, and voting technology.
- (D) Training election officials, poll workers, and election volunteers.
- (E) Improving, acquiring, leasing, modifying, or replacing voting systems and technology and methods State of Alaska Capital Project Summary Office of the Governor

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for casting and counting votes.

- (F) Improving the accessibility and quantity of polling places, including providing physical access for individuals with disabilities, providing non-visual access for individuals with visual impairments, and providing assistance to Native Americans, Alaska Native citizens, and to individuals with limited proficiency in the English language.
- (G) Establishing toll-free telephone hotlines that voters may use to report possible voting fraud and voting rights violations, to obtain general election information on their own voter registration status, specific polling place locations, and other relevant information.

This additional appropriation reflects the receipt of a new federal HAVA requirement payment of \$1,075,000 for FFY 2008 and 2009 with a GF Match requirement of \$56,500. Both the federal HAVA funds and the GF Match are requested in the FY2011 appropriation request to the Election Fund.

Amendment: additional federal HAVA funds of \$350.0 are available, with a match of \$18.4.
