Component Budget Summary

Component: Environmental Law

Contribution to Department's Mission

The Environmental Section provides advice and representation to several agencies, including primarily the Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC), to assist them in the performance of their duties related to environmental matters. The section's representation includes enforcement and recovery of costs and damages as well as defense of the state with respect to its role in a contaminated site or in carrying out its regulatory function.

Core Services

- Contaminated sites: In consultation with DEC, department attorneys pursue appropriate enforcement actions to
 ensure cleanup at contaminated sites or recommend to DEC that the state initiate a state led cleanup. In either
 case, the department pursues appropriate reimbursement of any state cleanup expenditures.
- Contaminated sites: The department consults with DEC in decisions to release a potentially responsible party from liability when available evidence indicates that the party is not, in fact, liable. Department attorneys work with DEC to negotiate prospective purchaser agreements for contaminated sites when appropriate.
- Oil spill prevention and response: The department advises and defends DEC regarding oil spill contingency plan
 approvals. When spills occur, investigative, enforcement, and litigation services are provided to ensure that the
 response is prompt and complete, that state costs and damages are reimbursed, and that violations of law are
 assigned fair consequences. Advice is provided with respect to the prevention and amelioration of fuel oil spills from
 above and underground storage tanks.
- Air and water quality: The department advises DEC regarding air permits and brings enforcement actions against
 entities violating clean air laws. The department provides advice on water quality issues including permitting for large
 mines, National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) primacy, marine vessel wastewater discharges,
 domestic wastewater, and drinking water. Advice is provided to the Village Safe Water program on a variety of
 issues related to that program.
- Coastal Management Program: The department advises the Department of Natural Resources relating to the Alaska Coastal Management Program (ACMP) and the performance of the agency's duties under that program.
- Public health: The department provides legal advice to DEC's Division of Environmental Health on public health issues, such as food safety, animal health, and pesticides.
- Homeland security: The department provides legal advice to various state officials regarding efforts to improve security of critical facilities, such as the TransAlaska Pipeline and drinking water supplies.
- Legal defense of state actions: The environmental law component defends state agencies and officials when they are sued for the performance of their duties. These include cleanup decisions, issuance of permits, approval of contingency plans, consistency determinations and other matters.

Key Component Challenges

- Litigate civil case against BP Exploration (Alaska) Inc. to recover civil assessments, penalties, costs, and damages
 to the State, including lost revenues, as a result of the 2006 oil spills from pipeline corrosion and the resulting 200608 partial shutdown of the Prudhoe Bay field.
- Resolve the Exxon Valdez oil spill reopener issue.
- Assist DEC in implementing state primacy in NPDES permitting.
- Hold the federal government accountable for non-compliance with state and federal environmental laws.
- Provide legal advice relating to ACMP program changes and ABC list revisions and defend challenges to district plan revisions.
- Assist DEC with continued implementation of Ballot Measure 2 (the "Cruise Ship Initiative") approved by the voters in the August 2006 primary elections.
- Defend challenges to DEC contingency plan decisions and develop oil spill prevention regulations.

- Help develop new regulations for DEC.
- Defend constitutional challenge to the Department of Natural Resource's regulatory process for issuance of miscellaneous land use permits and temporary land use permits.

Significant Changes in Results to be Delivered in FY2011

No changes are anticipated.

Major Component Accomplishments in 2009

In FY 2009, the section recovered \$2,287,731 for state costs and penalties related to violations of state environmental laws and obtained cleanup agreements with polluters with an estimated value of over \$4,886,000 for a total benefit to the state of over \$7,173,731. To obtain this money the Department expended only \$1,701,202. Moreover, the numbers for FY 2009 understate the return to the state, as cost recovery in FY 2009 was significantly lower than in previous years due to temporary reassignment of section resources to public records request work. Some examples of the work done by the Department that protects public health and safety are as follows:

- Coffman Cove Forest Service Road. Efforts by the department resulted in important cleanups of contaminated sites in Alaska. Due to the combined efforts of Law and DEC, the Western Federal Highways and the United States Forest Service agreed to perform an expedited road removal project on Prince of Wales Island at a cost of approximately \$1.5 million to remove acid rock contaminating salmon rearing streams. Additional streams are affected and Law and DEC have pressed WFH/USFS to spend, and WFH/USFS now plans to spend an additional \$10-11 million to address these contaminated streams this field season.
- Rural water and sewer projects. The Department assisted DEC with the development of statutory and regulatory revisions that enable DEC to obtain and administer economic stimulus (American Recovery and Reinvestment Act) grant funding for construction activities that will enhance infrastructure availability and capacity for drinking water and sanitary sewage systems throughout the state. DEC anticipates that up to \$43.0 million will be made available (dependant upon program expenditures) and administered under the Alaska Drinking Water Fund (\$19.5 million) and the Alaska Clean Water Fund (\$23.5 million). As a result of our section's work, DEC now has the authority to issue and administer both grants and loans under the drinking water and clean water funds.
- Air quality. The Department assisted DEC's Division of Air in obtaining statutory authority to issue and administer grants for the purpose of enhancing air quality or air pollution control measures throughout the state. The regulations implementing this new statutory authority are currently under development. We anticipate that DEC will be in a position to obtain federal grant funds to administer through this authority. An example is EPA's National Clean Diesel Emissions Reduction Program, which receives annual appropriations and an additional \$300 million in funding to be distributed to states under the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act.
- Department attorneys also provided advice to the ADEC Air Quality Division in connection with enforcement of air quality regulations related to the Alaska Railroad's operation of the Seward Coal Terminal. Over the past year, the Railroad has spent approximately \$125,000 in maintenance upgrades to address fugitive coal dust produced by loading/unloading operations at the coal terminal. The upgrades have consisted of replacing conveyor covers; installing or replacing seal skirts; installing wind guards; moving existing spray bars; installing additional spray bars on the stacker/reclaimer; installing new gap seals along the conveyor system; improving the water delivery system to spray bars; and developing a redundant watering system with a truck equipped with water cannons.
- Seafood processing plant. Department attorneys provided advice to the DEC Water Division on the issuance of an Interim Compliance Order by Consent (COBC) to Sea Level Seafoods, Inc. (Sea Level), a seafood processing company which has operated in Wrangell, Alaska for the past 30 years. The Interim COBC allowed Sea Level to continue processing seafood for the 2009 season and employ local workers, while at the same time helping to ensure that Sea Level's waste streams met the standards of applicable state and federal law. Previously, Sea Level had operated without securing any type of federal or state permit for discharges of its seafood waste into waters of the state. As a result of ADEC's enforcement effort, Sea Level has spent approximately \$25,000 in upgrading its grinding equipment.
- Medical wastes. Department attorneys provided advice to the DEC Air Division and assisted in the negotiation of a Compliance Order by Consent (COBC) that required Yukon-Kuskokwim Health Corporation to come into compliance

with air pollution regulations applicable to its handling of infectious medical waste at the Yukon-Kuskokwim Delta Regional Hospital in Bethel. The COBC addressed the facility's operation of its Hospital/Medical/Infections Waste Incinerator and provided a timeline under which the facility would discontinue operation of its incinerator. YKHC was assessed an \$83,257 fine for its regulatory violations and further agreed to install new technology at their facility to allow the discontinuation of its incinerator use for handling waste. The State collected \$15,000 of the fine amount and agreed to suspend the remaining balance of the fine upon proof that the new technology was operative.

- BP Pipeline Spills. The component assisted DEC in the investigation of the 2006 BP pipeline spills and shutdowns due to corrosion and filed an action against BPXA to recover penalties and damages.
- Kensington Mine. In earlier fiscal years, the component intervened on behalf of the state in the Kensington appeal, a challenge by environmental groups to the federal permits for tailings disposal at the Kensington Mine. The Federal District Court upheld the permits, but on appeal the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals reversed, invalidating the permits and halting further construction at the mine. Both the state and Coeur Alaska, Inc., owner of the mine, petitioned the U.S. Supreme Court for certiorari review, and the Court granted those petitions in June 2008. On June 22, 2009 the U.S. Supreme Court ruled in favor of the State and Coeur Alaska in their appeal from an adverse Ninth Circuit decision over the permitting of tailings disposal at the Kensington mine. The Court held that because mine tailings are "fill material" under federal regulations, the Army Corps of Engineers, rather than USEPA, has permitting jurisdiction over their disposal. This decision reverses the contrary 2007 opinion of the Ninth Circuit, effectively reinstating the Corps permit held by Coeur.
- ACMP. The component had significant responsibility for providing legal advice for important coastal management issues, including development of ACMP program changes, district plan amendments, and revision of the ABC List.
- Clean Water Act, Department lawyers played a key role with DEC in developing a program and an extensive regulation project as part of the state's application to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) for primacy of the NPDES Program under the Clean Water Act. The Department assisted with legislation needed to meet program requirements for federal approval. State primacy in this area will result in faster permitting decisions that are more accurately based on local conditions.
- Regulations. The component assisted DEC in a number of regulations projects.
- Public Records. The component assisted a number of agencies and the Office of the Governor in public records requests matters and negotiated a dismissal of *ACW v. Palin*.
