Project Description/Justification:

The alleged violations arose in connection with work initiated by DOT&PF to address damage caused by two 100-year floods that occurred on the Kenai Peninsula in October and November of 2002. DOT&PF restored roadways and public facilities at twelve sites placing bank protection along the Ninilchik, Resurrection, Kenai and Anchor River, and Deep Creek, in alleged violation of the CWA. If the funding is not provided to the non profit the EPA will consider us in breach of our agreement and will file suit.
