Project Description/Justification:

The Alaska Department of Transportation and Public Facilities' (DOT&PF) Research and Technology Transfer program is comprised of three Federal Highway Administration funding sources: State Planning and Research (SP&R), Local Technical Assistance Program (LTAP) and the Border Technology Exchange Program (BTEP).

DOT&PF's research program focuses on addressing transportation issues unique to design, construction and maintaining surface transportation infrastructure. Most projects are completed within two years. A Research Advisory Board comprised of Deputy Commissioners, Regional Directors and Headquarter Directors select research projects.

DOT&PF's Technology Transfer program is directly funded by the Federal Highway Administration Local Technical Assistance (LTAP) program. As the name implies, LTAP provides transportation related technical assistance and training to local governments. Program activities include publishing a quarterly newsletter, maintaining a lending library, operating a technical referral program and conducting training aimed at issues of interest to local governments.

The Border Technology Exchange Program is directly funded by the Federal Highway Administration. This program provides funding to exchange transportation related technologies with the Yukon Territories. For example, this funding pays for an exchange of information concerning the use of High Float Road Surfacing.
