Brief Summary and Statement of Need:

This is a new FY11 capital request to reconstruct Front Street in conjunction with municipally-funded utility improvements. This includes resurfacing concrete roadway, sidewalk additions and other improvements. As funding allows, reconstruct other streets, including storm drainage upgrades, sidewalk additions and other improvements. This project contributes to the Department's Mission by reducing the potential for injuries, fatalities and property damage and by improving the mobility of people and goods.

Project Description/Justification:

The project will enhance the downtown area for residents and visitors by upgrading and reconstructing the roads, sidewalks and utilities in accordance with the goals of the Wrangell Downtown Revitalization Plan (WDRP). This road is heavily traveled, with an Average Daily Traffic (ADT) of over 12,000 a day. The concrete roadway is deteriorating and in need of replacement. The project includes major safety improvements to pedestrian facilities, including work to bring the sidewalks into compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA). Additional work will address concerns for on-street parking conflicts and the lack of continuous pedestrian facilities.
