Additional Information / Prior Funding History:

Corps of Engineers federal participation in construction works requires a feasibility study and a favorable cost-benefit ratio. FY2009 - \$750,000; FY2008 - \$2,600,000; FY2007 - \$9,250,000; FY2006 - \$2,600,000; FY2004 - \$8,250,000; FY2001 - \$5,977,000; FY2000 - \$8,028,100; FY1999 - \$935,000.

Project Description/Justification:

The Corps of Engineers provides matching federal funds, typically at 80/20 but can vary depending on the type of work, for local government sponsored projects that are named in the Water Resource Development Act as passed by Congress and signed by the President. Alaskan municipalities continue to receive favorable federal support for needed harbor improvement projects and depend on state matching funds to complete these projects, which are sponsored by and will be owned and maintained by a local city or borough. Customarily, the department provides 50% of the local government's costs.

The St. Paul Harbor project has been advertised and is in construction. This \$18.3 million project is scheduled for completion at the end of 2011. This Corps of Engineers project has received Alaska delegation and federal financial support in the past, and will continue to receive federal funding in the future until it is completed. This request will be used to provide the remaining state match amount so that the project can be completed.
