The replacement facility will provide an area for growth of public education services in addition to providing a venue for the multitude of organizations in the area that request meeting space and activity centers.

Bear Creek Volunteer Fire Department (BCFD) provides services that include fire prevention education, fire suppression and fire protection. Vehicle extrication, basic life support, search and rescue, and swift water rescue. The Bear Creek Fire Service Area (BCFSA) is an unincorporated area that encompasses the outlying communities near Seward, Alaska which has a population of 2,175, and provides Mutual Aide Services to an additional 5,392 residents. The population doubles during the summer months. According to the State of Alaska Department of Transportation an additional 503,000 visitors travel through the service area. The visitors stay at guest facilities scattered throughout the service area.

The current facility is considered a major critical infrastructure component to the Eastern Peninsula for the Kenai Peninsula Borough (KPB). If a major event such as an earthquake and tsunami were to cut the Seward/Bear Creek area off from the rest of the KPB, the Bear Creek Volunteer Fire Department would be critical to emergency response efforts.

The current Bear Creek Fire Station has a multitude of deficiencies that are contributing to, but not limited to why the existing facility needs to be replaced:

- Does not meet seismic or life safety codes
- Does not meet the ADA Federal mandated standards

- Existing building is undersized with emergency response vehicles being stored outdoors and off-site.
- Rehabilitation of the current structure to meet standards and needs, has been determined to be financially unfeasible.

Meeting and training space is urgently needed for the volunteers as we grow to meet the demands of the community.

Project Timeline:

At this time the project is ready to start as soon as the appropriate funding is acquired. If this happens the construction could start for the new Multi-Use Facility in the spring of 2011 with a potential completion of the project in the spring of 2012.

How did the Service Area select this project as a funding priority?

The Fire Service Area Board of Directors selected construction funding as our priority at our October 12, 2010 Service Area Board Meeting as well as having done the same for the past three years.

How has the community shown support for this project? (Volunteer, money, resolutions, etc.)

In October 2007 the Service Area Voters approved the new Multi-Use Facility and issuance of bonds, by a 76% margin. In addition, the Bear Creek Fire Station is used by a multitude of community clubs and organizations for various activities.

What steps have been taken to date to get this project going?

In 2007 the Bear Creek Fire Service Area voters significantly supported construction of a new facility by a 76% pledging funds by approving bonds for \$1,400,000. Construction documents have been completed. The project is "Shovel Ready" with all of the necessary documents needed to start, including documentation from the Department of Environmental Conservation, Army Corp of Engineers, and the State of Alaska.

If a Community Meeting was conducted, how was it advertised? When and where was it held? Who attended?

An open house for the Multi-Use Facility was hosted by the Bear Creek Fire Department on Saturday, July 28, 2007, at the Bear Creek Fire Department. It was attended by an overwhelming number of Service Area residents and local business owners showing their support for the project. Annually the Fire Service Area budget is discussed in a public forum and the project was determined to be a priority since 2005.

Who owns the property and what is the status of the land for the project?

The property is owned by the Kenai Peninsula Borough on behalf of the Bear Creek Fire Service Area.

How will the project be constructed or accomplished?

The project is ready to start as soon as the appropriate funding is acquired. Construction could begin in the spring of 2011 with completion in the spring of 2012.

Who will own the project or facility?

Dear Representative Paul Seaton,

We are requesting your assistance in funding the \$3.8 million for the Bear Creek Community Multi-use Facility.

We have been working for several years to see that this become a reality and have completed architectural designs and construction plans making it ready to build. This is a shovel ready project; the \$3.8 million in funds that have been requested combined with local funds of \$1.4 million will get the project completed. Being able to locate all FD resources in one building would vastly improve the efficiency, operations and safety of the Volunteers that service the community.

Bear Creek Residents are the only Service Area requesting facilities that have met the requirements of Kenai Peninsula Borough Proposition No. 4 Passed at the October 2005 Regular Election, stating capital improvement projects in excess of \$1 Million are to be approved by the voters voting in an election of those citizens residing in the affected area or service area. This was passed by the Bear Creek Residents October 2007 with a 76% approval passing a \$1.4 million bond toward construction of our facility.


The community has also invested a significant total of funds (more than \$500,000) toward this project in studies, permits, architectural designs and construction documents.

Thank you for meeting with me last week regarding fire service issues.

We are looking forward to working with you on securing funding for the Bear Creek Community Multi-Use Facility this year.

I know you are aware of our issues with the current facility; however we would like to point out that we are one of the only services areas asking for over \$1 million that has met the requirements of Kenai Peninsula Borough Proposition No. 4 that passed in the October 2005 elections. This proposition state's that capital improvement projects in excess of \$1 million are to be approved by and election of the service area residents residing in the affected area or service area before any extensive planning or expenditures are made towards the project.

Approval of our project was passed by the Bear Creek residents in October 2007 with a 76% approval. Also, a bond of \$1.4 million toward construction was approved if we were able to raise an additional minimum of \$2 million for the project. To date nearly \$600,000 has been spent on planning, permits, and construction documents. Our project is "shovel ready".

The Bear Creek Fire Service Area and its Community have committed a large amount of its resources towards this project; your assistance is required for this to move forward.



I am writing out of concern for my volunteer Fire Department. I realize that you have visited the station many times and have seen first hand what the condition of the building is, however it really would be sure that you are aware of the impact that a new facility would have on our area.

Currently the Fire Department is "home" to 34 Volunteers from around our community that give their time once a week to train for emergency situations that may arise in our area. Those Volunteers deserve a new "home"... at this time when we all or most of us arrive for training there isn't nearly enough room or chairs to sit and absorb the life saving techniques that are expected to be applied at a moment's notice in response to the needs of our service area residents and visitors. As I looked around the room at our last training night meeting we had approximately twenty ^{Chairs} ~~chairs~~ for our members to sit in during training. Four of our Volunteers had to either stand or sit on boxes or workout equipment. It's embarrassing to me that our community expects these people to get up at 3am for ANYONE that may have an ailment, losing precious hours of sleep for another but our state/government delays to provide them with a proper place to train and save a life.

Offhand I can think of at least a half dozen times that you yourself traveled to Seward for one political event or another in the last year or so. At that time had your car gone off the road or you had a personal medical emergency while driving back and forth through our district every one of our Volunteers would have left their seat; be it a case of soda, a treadmill base or a folding chair, and have been to the aid of you and your staff. Without a second thought those Volunteers would be the ones to take your pulse, check your blood pressure and attempt to put your mind at ease ~~until~~ until the medical transport team arrived. We are asking that you give the Bear Creek Fire Service Area "a second thought" and support our pursuit of a new facility so that we may continue to provide the proper emergency services to our community and its surrounding area residence as well as to you, your staff and the 280,000 visitors that pass through our service area annually.

Whether the funds are secured this year or not the Bear Creek Volunteers will continue their mission to serve their community, even if that means that they have to put up with sitting on boxes, and training in below adequate facilities to save a life. I am writing this letter to you in support of funding for the Bear Creek Community Multi-Use Facility, I urge you to give strong consideration to funding the project to provide a proper "home" for training the Volunteers, for housing the apparatus and for responding to the needs of our growing community.
