Goldstream Valley Lions Club - Goldstream Valley Park Playground Equipment Improvement Project

Brief Project Description:

Provide local youths ages 5 to 12 with age-appropriate, skill building play equipment at the Goldstream Valley Lions Park by purchasing and installing climbing, balance, and strength- and agility-building structures on the park grounds.

Secured donations of \$6000 of in-kind labor and heavy equipment usage.

Detailed Project Description and Justification:

Outdoor playgrounds promote social, physical, and mental development of children of all ages. They promote healthy bodies, cooperation, self-confidence, autonomous thinking and problem solving, and diminish sedentary behavior and addiction to unhealthy activities. The Goldstream Valley Lions Park provides the residents of Goldstream Valley, located 10 miles north of Fairbanks, with a safe place to commune and recreate. However, at present there are two swing sets and one piece of play equipment available for the kids to play on, and that equipment is appropriate for children ages 18 months to 8. There are no sidewalks in the valley, and no safe place for kids to bike and play out of the street.

The Goldstream Valley Lions are aiming to provide that for the community by volunteering their time and skills to develop and expand the park. So far, they have installed the existing playground, built a community center on the grounds, and installed a playing field adjacent to the community center. The next phase of expansion is to clear a wooded area adjacent to the park and install several more pieces of playground equipment that aim to develop balance, agility, and coordination of children aged 5 to 13.

To accomplish this goal, we need to clear some trees on the north side of the park, fill that area with pea gravel, and order and install the equipment. \$6,000 dollars of tree removal and dirt work has been donated to the GV Lions by community members. The remaining capital being requested from the state in this proposal (\$40,000) will go toward purchasing the pea gravel and equipment, have it installed, and then inspected by the Fairbanks borough.

Install the equipment in fall of 2011 or spring of 2012
