Detailed Project Description and Justification:

This program constructs traffic calming and safety improvements throughout the Anchorage Roads and Drainage Service Area (ARDSA). Specific improvements will be identified and prioritized by the Traffic Department in conjunction with public involvement. Design and construction funding is proposed annually. Funding is proposed as a 50/50 local bond and state grant partnership. Several phases of improvements have been designed and constructed. On many neighborhood and collector roads, vehicles are driven above posted speeds which can create unsafe situations. Traffic calming measures are typically used to slow traffic.

Project Timeline:

Design and construction expenditures are anticipated in 2011 and 2012.
