*Funding Details:**This is a new request, funding history is unavailable.***Detailed Project Description and Justification:**

The Juneau School District Technology Plan calls for a technology upgrade cycle to replace outdated hardware and infrastructure on a basis of useful service life rather than large-scale purchases every seven (7) to ten (10) years. This permits schools to keep up with advances and current technology capabilities and allows students to receive training in relevant software. Currently, the highest upgrade priorities are for network upgrades at Riverbend & Floyd Dryden Schools. Current equipment at Riverbend and Floyd Dryden Schools are six (6) to ten (10) years old making it very obsolete by today's technical standards. Currently both schools have 10 Mbps and 100 Mbps switches. These switches provide network connectivity to the classroom. They will be replaced by Gigabit switches, ten times faster than most of the current switch ports. This allows digital content to be streamed from a local school server to classroom computers with virtually no restriction on speed. This is critical for streaming video. Below is a quote for the switches, \$105,600. The additional support will not be purchased. These switches will be installed by District IT Staff.

Dzantik'i Heeni Middle School has 82 computers older than five years in need of replacement. One of the labs is an assortment of old computers making it very difficult for instructors; an inordinate amount of time is spent overcoming computer difficulties. The 86 replacement computers would fully replace two labs with additional machines for classroom and teacher use. The Dzantik'i Heeni Middle School Site Council has recommended replacing all old computers at Dzantik'i Heeni Middle School.

The Site Technology Committee at DZ School recommends 82 Apple Desktop Models at approximately \$1149 each.

eBooks are dynamic teaching tools that enhance learning, both in the library and the classroom. Enhances grammar lesson, learn new vocabulary words as a librarian highlights them on the screen. Students doing research easily search for and take

notes on important information with the eBook's embedded tools. Many teachers build classroom activities around an eBook that is connected to an interactive whiteboard. eBooks make it easy for students to complete assignments based on specific sections of a book. eBooks features are effective and a great learning tool for special education students and those with special needs. The Juneau School District will share the collection electronically thereby using resources to their fullest potential.

The book collections in the Juneau School District Library collections in each school are outdated and in need of updating and refreshing. The average age of the collection at many of the schools are from 1989.




Harborview Elementary School

Harborview library has 14,772 titles and 23,242 copies mostly in book form. The average age of the collection is 1989. Harborview underwent a renovation during the 2008-2009 school year; a new space for the library was built. In order to fit in the new space, I withdrew 6000 books from the collection over the two year period. I make a point of updating our collection as much as possible with the funds we have, but I have to make hard choices between books kids like to read and curriculum support material. We also supplement with fundraising like hosting book fairs. As you can see we are still in dire need of updating and refreshing the collection. This analysis is no doubt indicative of most Juneau Public School Libraries, and I would say around the state as well. When I was asked what we could use that would help us with our collection, I immediately thought of e-books. By purchasing e-books, we are bringing 21st century learning into focus in the library and in the classroom. As a district we can share the collection electronically thereby using scarce resources to their fullest potential.

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Why e-Books

Besides the fact that e-books will be shared by all Juneau School Libraries, below is a description of how they may be used.

Follett eBooks are dynamic teaching tools that enhance learning, both in the library and the classroom. Bring a grammar lesson to life when you diagram sentences with a graphic novel. Beginning readers learn new vocabulary words as a librarian highlights them on the screen. Students doing research easily search for and take notes on important information with the eBook's embedded tools.

Many teachers build classroom activities around an eBook that is connected to an interactive whiteboard. Students can search and highlight vocabulary words, read along with the teacher to enhance reading skills, or diagram sentences right in the book on the screen. eBooks make it easy for students to complete assignments based on specific sections of a book. Many schools allow users access to eBooks from home, either from their electronic library catalog of the FollettShelf, allowing students and teachers to view and check out eBooks 24/7.

eBooks can be used with special education students. Users can zoom in or out to make the text larger, and select from several page views to customize the view of the eBook. There are also alternate text Tool Tips that display, in words, the

function of the buttons within the reader. The Read Aloud feature in the Full-featured Online Reader can also assist special needs students. There is also a dictionary feature.
