The City of Akiak is in need of a loader to maintain the landfill which is a health hazard at this time due to lack of heavy equipment to maintain the landfill, the City has only one operational old excavator that is used for mainly hauling power generator fuel from the tank farm to the generator site. For the last 10-12 years, the City has had to depend on the Water and Sewer Project heavy equipment to maintain the landfill, maintain the roads and for hauling the fuel trailer for the generators, but the equipment is no longer available. We have one old D4 tractor it's so old they don't make parts for it anymore and is costly to maintain, the money will be used to purchase a new loader and to cover the freight cost to Akiak.
