This will be the last group of poles to be replicated and all of the large poles in the Hydaburg Totem Park will be completed. This project has had a very positive affect for the culture of the people of Hydaburg and has developed traditional marketable skills for the youth of our community.

The Hydaburg Cooperative Association in conjunction with the City of Hydaburg and Haida Corporation have been working together and formed a group called "The United Front". One of our major projects is the Hydaburg Totem Park. We have been fundraising and grant writing for the purpose of replication or refurbishing of the existing totems which have been in place since the 1930's and are in dire need of work. Without attention and work the totems will fall very soon.

With this effort in mind, each entity gave \$20,000. so that the replication project could continue this year. Our master carvers and apprentices donate the majority of their work and time and get paid a minimal amount so that the project can continue. The people of Hydaburg also continue to donate whatever they can to help with the project. As a result of this effort, we have completed 8 totems, are currently working on 2, and have 12 more to complete.

We support the City of Hydaburg's efforts to seek funding to continue the Totem project. We ask for your support and help to fund this project. Not only does it help preserve a Totem Park which is in the National Register of Historic Places, it helps us to preserve a piece of our culture, which we are struggling to keep and maintain.
