The village has submitted a request for funding from Pebble Fund. If successful a full service area will be installed, if not just a parking space and basketball court.

Detailed Project Description and Justification:

The Iliamna Village Council would like to clear land set aside by Iliamna Natives LTD under 14C3 to make a playground/activity area. This would allow for community members, families and other organizations to hold safe, secure, fun activities outdoors. Iliamna currently does not have any such facility for these functions. We plan to clear land, build a parking lot, construct a basketball/tennis/hockey court, outdoor sand volleyball court, and jungle gym playground. The area is centrally located to allow easy access for the entire community while keeping it away from residential areas to keep noise activity to a minimum level of disturbance.

Project Timeline:

We would start the purchasing of raw materials in the spring to ensure early barging and then have the construction throughout the summer months with completion before season ends.
