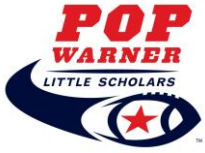

Representatives Hawker, Stolze and Fairclough:

On behalf of the Sleeping Lady Mountain Lions, I am writing to request your help in our efforts to obtain funds for the crucial replacement of the roof at the at the Eagle River Lions Clubhouse. The estimated to cost is approximately \$102,850.

The building receives extensive use from the Sleeping Lady Mountain Lions. It is the largest indoor facility in the area providing a meeting room with the capacity to hold 250 guests, as well as a spacious, modern commercial kitchen.

The Sleeping Lady Mountain Lions utilizes this building twice a month for our regular meetings. Here are a few of the additional uses for this building that I believe is vital to this community:

1. The building is used for our Valentine Dinner Fundraiser that provides \$15,000 to \$20,000 in funds to our local children in the form of scholarships each year.
2. Lions District 49A uses this building several times a year for our district meetings that accommodate approximately 100 people where we provide breakfast and lunch to all the cabinet members.
3. Several times a year the building is used for weddings and the Sleeping Lady Mountain Lions provide the catering of these weddings to raise funds

for our community account that provides assistance to local people in need. The need could be for medical bills assistance, living assistance, etc.

4. We utilize this building for the *Tour de Cure* by providing food and water to participants of this event that are raising funds to find a cure for diabetes.
5. At Christmas time, this building is vital to our *Tree of Giving* program. We use the building from Thanksgiving until Christmas for storage, organization and delivery of gifts to approximately 100 needy families each year. Last year we wrapped approximately 3000 gifts and provided Christmas to 178 children in the Chugiak-Eagle River area. While we are running our Tree of Giving project, the Eagle River Lions is providing food baskets to these needy families.

I could go on explaining the need of this community building but I think this gives you an idea of how important this building is to this community.

Dear Senator Dyson and Representatives Hawker, Stolze and Fairclough:

On behalf of the Eagle River Lions Club, I am writing to request your help in our efforts to obtain State of Alaska for the crucial replacement of our roof at the at the Eagle River Lions' Clubhouse. The estimated to cost is approximately \$102,850.

The building receives extensive use from Eagle River, Chugiak and Anchorage residents as it is the largest indoor facility in the area providing a meeting room with the capacity to hold 250 guests, as well as a spacious, modern commercial kitchen. There are many non-profit organizations such as the: Lions of District 49A, Sleeping Lady Mountain Lions, Boy and Girl Scouts of America, Hope Community Resources, the Boys & Girls Club, Focus, Inc., Tour de Cure, Knik Little League, and the Pop Warner football Club who utilize our building for meeting and functions. . The Eagle River Lions do not charge a building rental fee to these groups and absorbs the cost of maintenance and utilities of the building along with the surrounding grounds.

The original building was built in 1968 with funds solely provided by the Eagle River Lions. In 1994, the building was revised for Special Olympics to use, and also an additional storage unit was built a few years later, both with monies from the State. In 2002, we began to have problems with the roof leaking and ice damming in some areas. These problems resulted in water seeping into the ceiling insulation, pooling in some areas, and then causing damage in the interior of the building. In 20089, there was ice and snow damage that took the guards and gutter off of the room. In April of 2010, the extent of the roof damage was realized when the snow began to thaw resulting in water logged sheet rock and accumulated puddles on the floor. The Eagle River Lions Club has put this project to the forefront of the items that will require repairs immediately.

Due to the cost of construction, the Eagle River Lions recognize the fact that we must secure additional monies in order to fulfill the requirements which are desperately needed. We are requesting funds from other Lion Clubs and Non-Profit organizations that utilize this building, along with fundraisers, to help with off-set of the expense with this major project.

Below is a list of the costs for repairs and replacement of this roof along with the costs necessary to maintain the roof the winter of 2010-2011 until repairs can begin next summer:

2.	24 Gage standing seam metal roofing	\$ 17,500.00
3.	2” fiberglass blanket insulation	\$ 3,300.00
4.	Ridge Vent	\$ 500.00

7.	Labor	<u>\$ 74,000.00</u>

With this funding, as in past years, these facilities will benefit from far-reaching community support represented by pledges of generous in kind donations of equipment, engineering, materials and labor. The necessary repairs we envision will make for a more enjoyable experience for all who utilize this building.

We ask that you continue to support our organization in our joint mission to provide safe recreational place for the families and the youth of our community. Again, our request is to obtain \$102,850 in funding for the replacement of the roof.

For decades the Eagle River Lions Club has been a vital part of the community, funding and maintaining the 40 acre park in Eagle River. Many years ago there was a huge demand in the area for a facility that would accommodate a large number of people. Seeing the need and having the land available, the Lions took the initiative to seek grant funding and exand the "club house" into a community building. This building has been utilized by hundreds, if not thousands of community members, non-profits and business over the years.

The Eagle River Lions have made the building accessible at a very reasonable, yet competitive price to everyone. Without assistance to fix their roofing problems, the building will begin to deteriorate, leaving it unusable.
