Current underground tanks that feed fire hydrants do not meet updated standards. This project will bring them up to current gallon requirements

**Detailed Project Description and Justification:**

CGFR has 7 underground tanks in our Fire Service Area that are used as fire hydrants. We respond to house fire in our area with both fire engines and tankers. When the water in the engine and tankers have been used up the tankers respond to these underground tanks to refill and respond back to the fire to refill and provide water to the engine. At the time these tanks were placed in the ground the required gallon to receive credit from ISO was 20,000. Due to regulation changes now the required gallons is 35,000. CGFR has acquired two 20,000 tanks that we would like to put underground next to an existing tank to up the total gallons at 40,000. At the same time we plan to upgrade the pumps inside the tank to pump more gallons per minute. This will reduce the time it takes to fill the tankers and return to the scene faster.
