The federal Drinking Water Capitalization Grant requires States to issue 30% of the funding as subsidies (a loan forgiveness process). This program has in the past functioned strictly as a loan program until fiscal year 2011 when this provision was added to the federal budget. In order to implement this provision, an appropriation is necessary to properly record the loan forgiveness payment as an expense in the Alaska Drinking Water Fund. This project contributes to the Department's End Result A - Citizens are Protected.
