## **Brief Summary and Statement of Need:**

## **Project Description/Justification:**

Funding is requested to upgrade Alaska Military Youth Academy (AMYA) buildings to ensure a safe and productive environment for students and staff that promote educational and vocational opportunities for at-risk youth in Alaska.

AMYA operates from a campus that was constructed in the 1970's for short term use by the Alaska Army National Guard forces during annual two-week trainings. Facilities are concrete block construction on concrete slab. Minor modifications were made in 1994 to house the AMYA ChalleNGe Program. The Department of Military and Veterans Affairs has incrementally addressed deferred maintenance issues to bring the barracks, classrooms, restroom, and shower facilities up to current standards throughout the multi building complex. Projects identified below are based on a comprehensive AMYA facilities "Condition Survey Report" in March 2007. Priorities and cost estimates may need to be changed to accommodate emergency maintenance projects not listed,

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actual project costs, and other considerations.
