Project Description/Justification:

The Counterdrug Support Program (CDSP) encompasses two critical areas: Drug Interdiction and Drug Demand Reduction (DDR). The Drug Interdiction program provides assistance to law enforcement agencies working in investigations or prosecutions that result in a federal forfeiture. This participation allows the state to receive federal funds as a result of forfeiture situations. Funds are receipted and expended in accordance with the U.S. Department of Justice's (USDOJ) guidance, primarily in the area of technological support supplies and/or facility improvements to the program.

Drug Demand Reduction incorporates experiential learning and facilitation its drug education and positive life skills instruction. The curriculum is provided to youth statewide.
