**Brief Summary and Statement of Need:**

Funding is requested to address capital improvement projects for three of the 96 Alaska Army National Guard locations: Fairbanks, Anchorage, and Wasilla. Projects are necessary to meet space requirements, code requirements, property protection, conditions improvements, and the lodging needs of soldiers.

**Additional Information / Prior Funding History:**

Cumulative appropriations dating back to FY2002 total \$27 million of federal and general fund match.

**Project Description/Justification:**

The mission of the Facilities Management Office of DMVA is to provide, maintain and operate safe, secure, high quality facilities and training areas for the Alaska National Guard on a cost effective basis which meet or exceed mission requirements, environmental compliance standards, and energy efficiencies.

Funding is requested to address capital improvement projects for the Alaska Army National Guard Facilities in Fairbanks, Anchorage, and Wasilla. This project requests \$3,650,000 federal authority to receive federal funds from the National Guard Bureau and \$100,000 general fund match. The percentage of State/Federal participation is determined by project and facility classification in accordance with National Guard Regulations and fluctuates based on specific projects and priorities. Priorities and cost estimates may need to be changed to accommodate emergency projects not listed, actual project costs, and other considerations.

The Alaska Army National Guard depends heavily on federal funding for the 237 buildings at 96 locations across the State. It is to the States' benefit to take advantage of federal funding opportunities that become available to renew facilities, reduce deferred maintenance, and lower operational costs by funding a small percentage of the total cost.

The unintended consequence of federal funds not given the appropriate state match is that funding can only be spent on federal installations. This reduces the ability to renew and replace facilities needed by guard members in rural Alaska.
