Project Description/Justification:

The Alaska Army National Guard is in need of a barracks facility for soldiers who train at the Alcantra Armory complex. Billeting (lodging) is not currently available at this location and units have been outsourcing billeting at a large expense to their training budget. Construction of a barracks facility would be a long term benefit to troops coming in from all regions of the state for annual training, consolidated training and emergency duty at Alcantra.
