Project Description/Justification:

This project designs and constructs a transpired solar energy collection wall. The collection wall would be installed exterior to the existing building wall on a sun exposed side for gathering solar energy. Solar energy would heat the air within the constructed wall cavity. The heated air will be used to augment the hangar bay heating system and for pre-heating office area ventilation air. The existing ductwork and direct digital control systems would be altered and programmed to distribute the captured heat to fully benefit from this renewable energy system. Priorities and cost estimates may need to be changed to accommodate emergency maintenance projects not listed, actual project costs, and other considerations.
