Brief Summary and Statement of Need:

Snowmobiling is one of Alaska's fastest growing outdoor recreation activities. There is a growing demand to develop and maintain trails and trailheads to provide for safe riding opportunities and to educate riders on safe riding practices. The end result is a variety of safe, accessible, well maintained snowmobile trails. Funds for this program are provided by snowmobile registration fees paid by Alaskans. Funds are distributed in the form of matching grants for trail and trailhead development and maintenance, grooming, safety education, trail identification, and to establish legal trail easements. Grants are to organizations, businesses, agencies, local governments, and individuals.

Project Description/Justification:

This project is funded by snowmobile registrations that are dedicated for snowmobile trail and trailhead development, grooming, and safety education programs. This will be the ninth year of the program, grant decisions are made with the consultation of a Snowmobile Trails Advisory Committee (SnowTRAC), a citizen committee representing all regions of the state.

Snowmobile users benefit from the registration fees they pay on their snowmobiles by having marked and maintained snowmobile trails. This provides safety benefits to riders. Alaskans die in snowmobile accidents at twice the rate of any other state. trails. It also has the potential of reducing search and rescue costs by reducing the chances of snowmobilers getting lost. Trespass is also reduced if snowmobilers have marked and maintained trails. Because this is a matching grant program, grantees provide cash, labor and equipment to match at least 25 percent of state provided grant funds, effectively stretching state funds. Anchorage Economic Development Corporation estimates that snowmobile sales and activity in Alaska results in approximately \$54 million in annual private sector expenditures.

*Due to the increasing cost of grooming snowmobile trails and the growing demand for more trail grooming, efforts will be made by the snowmobile community to increase registration fees. Current levels of funding do not support the demand for snowmobile trail projects. Thus far, it has been proposed that registration fees increase from 5 dollars per year to 20 dollars per year. This will quadruple the amount of funding available for projects and will meet the increased demand for snowmobile trails and safety programs requested by the public.

Why is this Project Needed Now?:

Many of Alaska's snowmobile trails need to be groomed on a weekly basis to ensure the safety of riders. The grant program provides an opportunity to groom these trails and reserve existing recreational access throughout the state.
