#### **Project Description/Justification:**

This project replaces a "cache" structure that has a leaky roof and rotting superstructure. The Haines Area office is responsible for wildland fire protection on 1.5 million acres, and administers resource management on more than 12.9 million acres in Southeast Alaska. The old structure is used by Forestry staff to maintain and store vehicles, firefighting tools and equipment, and resource management tools and equipment. It provides a workbench and a vehicle bay, the only such workspace for Forestry in the entire Haines area. The current state of the old building endangers personnel, and the vehicles and firefighting inventory it contains.

By Statute (AS41.15.010 – 41.15.170), the Division of Forestry manages state forested lands for sustainable use and protects more than 180 million acres of natural resources and other values at risk from threat of wildland fire. The Division's geographic areas of responsibility encompass 6 large parts of the State and include offices for Fairbanks, Delta, Tok and interior Alaska; Soldotna/Kenai and the Kenai Peninsula; Palmer/Wasilla and the Mat-Su Valley and Southcentral Alaska including Anchorage; McGrath and Southwest Alaska; Glennallen and the interior and coastal Copper River Valley; and Haines and the northern portion of Southeast Alaska. Forestry buildings where the public visits and where staff regularly works, have critical deferred maintenance needs.

Continued stopgap repairs to substandard structures and limited funding available for permanent maintenance solutions have resulted in operational inefficiencies, damage to goods and equipment, and compromise to safe storage of fuel, equipment, and hazardous materials. The state continues to occupy deteriorating buildings where the public regularly visits to obtain burning and wood-cutting permits; negotiate and sign timber sale contracts; provide contracted firefighting equipment and services; obtain fire and resource information; and attend public meetings. State staff also works from these to prepare for and manage wildland fires, and administer forest management activities.

Assuring that spaces in State public facilities meet state needs is critical to continuing division operations. Addressing this responsibility now ensures suitable protection of \$125.0 in firefighting tools and equipment in Haines.
